Mihi Whakatau on Monday

Please join us at 8:30 am on Monday morning as we welcome friends and whanau to our beautiful new school. **Mihi whakatau** is the Māori term used to describe a formal speech of welcome. It is traditionally used for welcoming, introductions, openings and general purpose which take place off the marae. It is a tradition we wish to establish as part of the way we will welcome families in the future.

The format is as follows:

- 8:30 Assemble at school
- 8:45 Whanau and friends move quietly into school grounds and sit in Kaunuku spaces on the tiered seating. Speakers and Year 7 and 8 students sit on paepae.
- Blair will speak on behalf of school and waiata to follow
- Speaker from visitor's group, followed by waiata
- Hongi and hariru (handshake) between those on paepae
- Claire Howison, Principal and Suzy Petersen (eBOT Chair) to speak
- Invitation for those wishing to plant the tree to move to field
- Morning tea in and outside the staffroom.

We imagine the process will conclude at 10am. Children and families will then be welcome to visit the learning spaces and have a look around the school. Year 1 - 4 children then head home and our older students stay at school for the day and will involved in a leadership programme that includes road patrol training.

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What to bring: Y1-4 your stationery and biggest smile. Y6/7/8 your lunch, stationery, hat, togs and towel.

What to wear: This is a semi formal occasion so tidy dress and children in uniform is appropriate.

We will return the sod at our formal opening on March 22nd.

Tuesday and Beyond

We welcome students from 8:30 am for a 9:00 am start. Please send children with togs and a towel as we may use the sprinklers on these very hot days!

Devices - if you are bringing a device to school we would like you to first fill out a BYOD agreement. These can be downloaded from our website or picked up from the office.


Uniform - if this hasn't yet arrived please wear navy or colours close to the school uniform.

School Hours - Monday - Friday, 9am - 3pm. We welcome children onsite from 8:15 (no active supervision) into the classes from 8:30. Similarly, children will need to be collected by 3:15pm. They can go home and check in and come pack to play.

Lunches - We don't yet provide an option for bought lunches. We would like you to support us to minimise waste by lunches that are, 'pack in, pack out'. Where possible containers are used instead of disposable bags. If rubbish is generated children will bring it home for disposal.
